As a challenge both to this perception (accurate or not) and to us priests who perhaps feel a pull in that uninspiring direction, stands the mighty image of what we see in the Gospel this Sunday.  Jesus sent out his apostles, "two-by-two, with power over demons, and without money belts." Two-by-two: they enjoyed deep fellowship and brotherhood. Power over demons: they were anything but harmless. These men wielded enormous power against evil. Without money belts: they were not self-sufficient. They needed others to help them. Not lonely, but in community. Not harmless but armed with massive spiritual energy. Not self-sufficient, but poor and in need of help.  This is a challenge to me, and perhaps to all of us, living in a rich, secularized, and individualized culture. Do I embrace my priestly ministry in deep fellowship with other priests? Do I speak and act boldly to drive out evil where it is found? Do I live poorly and simply, trusting in the help of those around me even for basic needs? The fruitfulness of priestly ministry largely depends on these three traits. Let's pray for all priests — and, by extension, all of us Christians — to live more like Jesus' communal, poor, and powerful apostles.  — Father John Muir ©LPi


### ST. VINCENT'S RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMS 2024 – 2025

#### DOMINICAN MISSION FOUNDATION MISSIONS APPEAL:

Fr. Jordan Bradshaw, O.P., will be celebrating some Masses at St. Vincent de Paul Church for his Missions Appeal throughout California this summer. On Saturday, July 27th, he will be celebrating the 5 pm Mass, and Sunday, July 28th, the 7:30 and 9 am Masses. For six decades, the Dominican Mission Foundation has been providing spiritual, medical, material, and community care for the native people of their mission areas, which currently include Mexico, Guatemala, Equatorial Guinea, Iraq, the Alaskan Wilderness, and Puerto Rico. (Past mission areas, whose goals we successfully met, in-

clude Vilnius, Lithuania, Kisumu, Kenya, Cuidad Juarez, Mexico, and the Tala Leper Colony, Philippines.

Fr. Bradshaw entered the Western Dominican Province in 1983 and was ordained priest in 1992. He has served for 28 years in various assignments, from Oregon to Arizona, California to Washington, and most recently as Director of Campus Ministry at the University of Washington's Prince of Peace Newman Center for 12 years. After a year's sabbatical and a semester at the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome, his current assignment, beginning in June 2022, is Director of the Dominican Mission Foundation, based in San Francisco.
